Message From the Desk of the Director

It is a moment of profound significance as we celebrate the 94th Foundation Day of the All India Institute of Hygiene and Public Health (AIH&PH) on 30th December 2025. On this auspicious occasion, I extend my warmest greetings and best wishes to our dedicated students, esteemed faculty, diligent staff, and our valued partners in public health.



Since its inception in 1932, this Institute has stood as a beacon of excellence in public health education and research. As we look back, on nearly a century of service, from pioneering the Bhole Committee Report to modern innovations in health - we remain committed to our core mission of protecting and promoting the health of the nation.

The year 2025 has been a year of remarkable action and achievement. Our collective efforts have translated into tangible impacts across training, research, and community services.

Our academic and field wings have been exceptionally productive in strengthening the public health workforce:

- **National Programs & Fellowships:** We successfully conducted the Intermediate Field Epidemiology Training (I-FETP) and the Associate Fellow of Industrial Health (AFIH) fellowship, reinforcing our role in specialized health training. Other prominent initiatives included a new Capacity Building Program on Management of Public Health Emergencies for District Health Officers across the Northeastern States and West Bengal.
- **Specialized Training Outreach:** Through 18 Short Trainings and 41 Field Trainings, we equipped over 1,140 participants with essential skills. Notable sessions included Biological Hazards training for NDRF and SDRF personnel, an Operation Research workshop, a Strategic Workshop on "Worker's Safety & Health in Changing Climate," and a specialized training program on Occupational Health Laboratory instruments for laboratory staff from across the country.
- **Public Awareness:** We reached over 2,500 individuals through 50 awareness programs and the observation of key health days.
- **Community Health:** Our commitment to the grassroots was evident in the screening of 1,118 persons for NCDs in the villages of Singar. We also conducted health camps for essential community service providers, including ASHA workers, Medical Doctors, and Traffic Personnel.
- **Clinical Excellence & Research:** We served over 40,000 patients through our OPD services and administered 1,062 Yellow Fever vaccinations, maintaining our role as a critical services provider. Simultaneously, our academic rigour resulted in 25 Research Papers in prestigious journals and several accolades for our Post Graduate Trainees (PGTs).

OVERVIEW OF THE INSTITUTE

All India Institute of Hygiene & Public Health (AIHH&PH), Kolkata, was first Public Health institute of South East Asia established in 1932 dedicated for teaching, training, and research in the field of Public Health.

The Institute is premier and unique Public Health (PH) Institution of the Government of India and contributed key public health innovations viz. the Primary Health Care set-up including the outreach, subcentre, PHC and its staffing as recommended by Sir Joseph Bhore Committee (1938-45), India's 1st and global 2nd blood bank jointly with Bengal Red Cross (1942), bore-hole/ pour-flush toilets (1943) which were the precursor of modern Sulabh Shauchalay, Arsenic treatment plant (2001-08), etc.

This Institution was also associated with many other Public Health achievements, viz, NACO's initiatives in eastern India, Health and Nutritional Status of the Jarwa Tribes of the Andaman and Nicobar Islands and creating new training courses and curriculum for Maternal & Child Health (jointly with UNICEF, WHO & GOI – 1930s), Industrial Health (jointly with ILO & GOI – 1950s), and MD in PSM (1970s), all well before the PG component of MCI(now NMC) was even conceptualized at national level. In order to keep pace with changing times and evolving public health scenario and requirements, AIHH&PH realigned its Vision, Mission and Goals and has modified its working also.

Other departments also contribute significantly in conducting the courses.

The courses are affiliated to the West Bengal University of Health Sciences, Kolkata for all the courses except Master of Veterinary Public Health which is affiliated to University of Calcutta. Among the above courses, MD (Community Medicine) and the three-year MPH (Epidemiology) Course are recognised by NMC.

Infrastructure

The Institute operates its academic and administrative activities from the main building at 110 Chittaranjan Avenue, Kolkata 700073 and the second campus at JC 27 and JC 27 B, Sector III, Salt Lake. It has a Rural Health Unit and Training Centre at Singur, Hooghly, West Bengal and Urban Health Unit and Training Centre at Chetla, Kolkata, West Bengal. The Institute has staff quarters at both the places, Kolkata and Singur. Moreover, it has Hostel Facilities for students in Kolkata (Near Main Campus as well as in Second Campus) and Singur. In addition, we have Guest House Facilities near main campus as well as in the second campus.

The RHU&TC, Singur has two Primary Health Centres, one at Diarah and another at Anandnagar and each of them has sub-centres. In addition to the sub-centres, the Primary Health Centres have other functional units which may be considered as sub-centres without fixed structure.

The Institute has well equipped laboratories, library, computer lab, classrooms, auditorium, and conference rooms. It has adequate LAN and Internet facilities with NKN connectivity and intercom facilities.

Library

All India Institute of Hygiene & Public Health has one of the premier reference libraries on public health sciences. The library has been identified as the Regional Medical Library in the Eastern Region by D.G.H.S, and Ministry of Health & Family Welfare and ERMED facility. It has sufficient resources for the users.

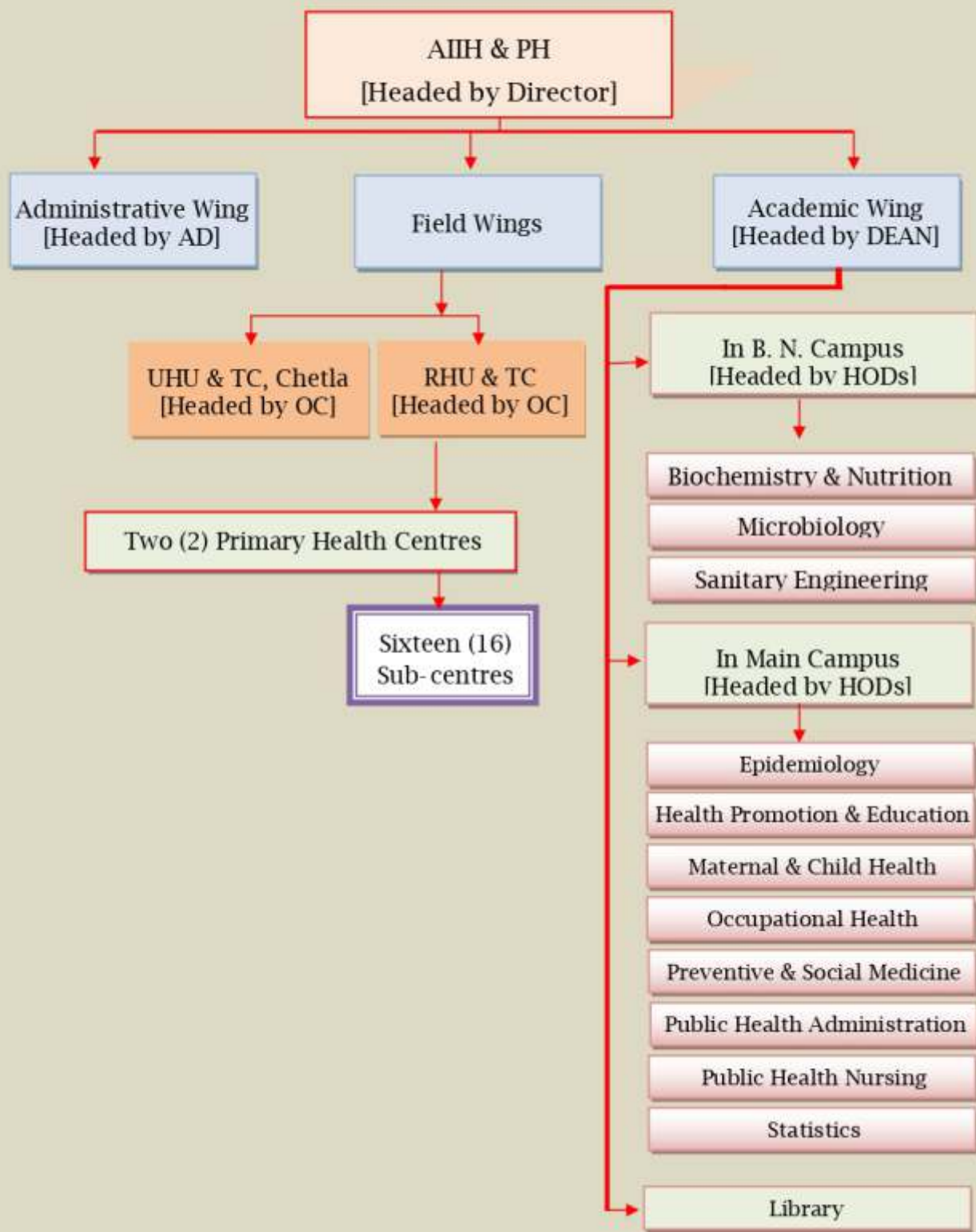

NEW INITIATIVES & ACHIEVEMENTS

New initiatives in 2025:

- i) Intermediate Field Epidemiology Training program (I-FETP) one year course for doctors working in North eastern and Eastern states of India was started in collaboration with NCDC, Delhi
- ii) Training on Biological Hazards for NDRF and SDRF personnel were conducted.
- iii) Designing and development of new bilingual website and migration to cloud is under process and new website to be launched soon.
- iv) Workshops on “Operation research in Public health” were conducted for CHS of Regional Directorate of Health & Family welfare, GoI
- v) National webinar on “Communication Strategies for Vulnerable Population” in collaboration with NIHFV
- vii) Development of Public Health skill lab is under process

Achievements of 2025:

- Total PG Students enrolled in 2025 were 184. Overall success rate in examination was 99%
- The Institute conducted various Short Courses/ Training Programmes/ Internship for capacity building in public health.
- In 2025, 20 Short Trainings for 385 participants from different states of the country, 44 Field trainings for 890 participants, 50 Awareness-outreach programmes for 2500 participants were conducted, 1118 persons were screened for NCDs in villages of Singur block.
- 200 NDRF and SDRF personnel were trained in Biological Disaster management.
- Yellow fever vaccination for 1285 international travelers was given
- Under “Swasth Nari Sashakta Parivar” campaign, Health and awareness camps were held benefitting 321 persons.
- Strategic Workshop on “Worker’s safety & Health in Changing Climate” was conducted
- Prominent trainings include PH Emergencies Management on behalf of Disaster Management Cell of MoHFW (3 rounds) from seven North eastern states and Union territory, PH Nursing Training for Nursing Colleges across the country, Research Methodology, Systematic Review & Meta-analysis, Operations Research, Scientific Writing, Foundation Course on Occupational Health, One Health, Social and Behaviour change communication, Cyber security etc.
- Faculty and Residents of AIIHPH have published 28 Research Papers in reputed International and National Journals and presented papers in International, National and Regional Conferences. PGTs participated and won best Paper/ Poster/ Other Awards quiz, debate, and poster contests and the prestigious IAPM, IPHA, IAPSMYLC 2025, HRD scheme of Dept. of Health research, World congress of Gerontology and Geriatrics 2025.
- Three faculty were involved in National & International level research projects.

- i) To start new courses viz. One-year Diploma in Sanitary Health Inspector course, Field epidemiology program FEP-OH on One health in collaboration with NCDC, Delhi. *two-year Master in Public Health (MPH)* course for candidates from medical and non-medical backgrounds etc.

The training in Health Education at post graduate level is directed to study and understand various factors involved in the process of imparting knowledge and changing attitude and behaviour of the people so as to promote health. It is an integral part of the institute and actively involved in teaching and training activities in the field of health education and promotion; especially the techniques and methods of assessing health needs, educational needs and planning for changing undesirable health behaviour to different post graduate courses run by the institute. Since 1966 the department is conducting a Diploma course in Health Education and has produced more than 1200+ trained manpower in Health Promotion and Education and M.Sc. in Public Health (Health Promotion) was started in 2022.

DEPARTMENT OF MICROBIOLOGY

The Department of Microbiology of All India Institute of Hygiene & Public Health, Kolkata is concerned with the study of fundamental Microbiology related to the Public Health and Infectious diseases.

It is probably the First Institute/College having a separate Microbiology Section in India. It was established in the year 1932 during British Era. Prof. K.V. Krishnan was the First Head of the Department.

The department is involved in teaching Medical Microbiology to all courses run in the Institute. Department conducts a two-year Post graduate course Master of Veterinary Public Health (MVPH) under the University of Calcutta. The department is involved in teaching, training & research activities including the guidance of dissertation work of the Post graduate students of the department and other departments of AIH&PH.

The department is also a Nodal centre for inoculation of Yellow fever vaccination for the International travellers visiting African, South African countries, crew members of flight or vessel.

Mission



The department mission is teaching, training & research activities including the guidance & supervision of dissertation work of the Post graduate students of the department and other departments. In this 21st century getting good quality of drinking water is a challenge thus Microbiology department is involved in providing potable water testing to the rural and urban area communities to know status of water which they are consuming in their daily life.

In fact, various statistics theories and data analytics software viz. SPSS, R, Advance Excell are inter-twined which are taught with the help of Computer Lab. The computer laboratory (Room No. 410) of AIIH & PH was expanded with addition of 6 more computers with updated cyber protection. Ergonomic chairs were placed for improving participants' comfort. New and advanced projector was also placed.

iGot Karmayogi:

This institute is the one of the participating institutes in Annual Capacity Building Plan (ACBP) of Ministry of Health and Family Welfare. The institute has been allocated many training programs in the ACBP for creation of training course modules.

E-office:

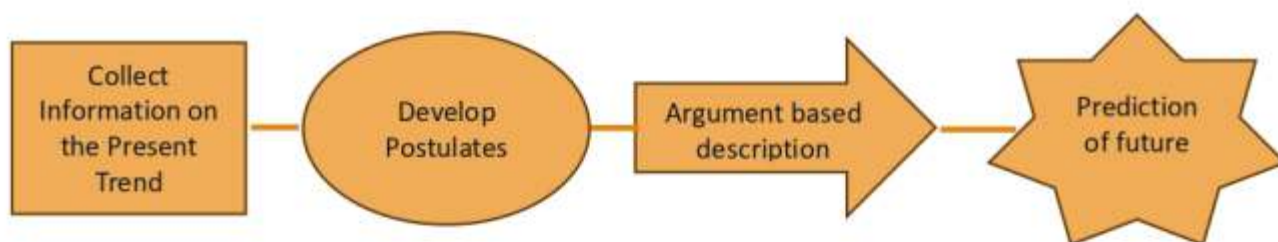

Server/Router Room:

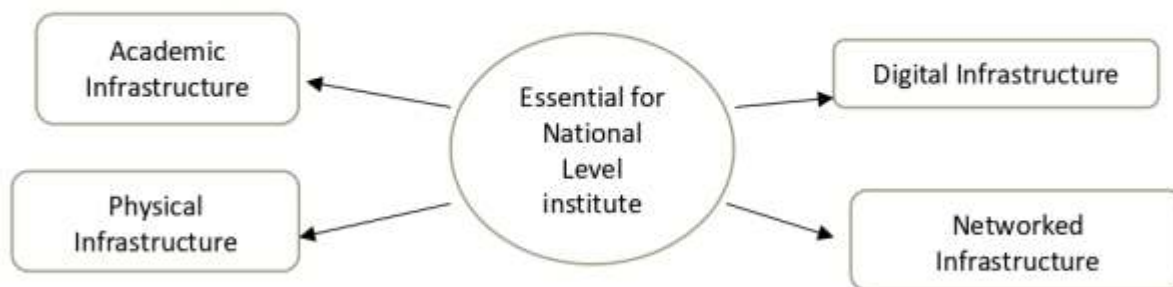
The server room was overhauled and a plan has been made to further upgrade it so that internet connectivity of higher speed may be achieved.

INFRASTRUCTURE DEVELOPMENT

The whole physical infrastructure of AIIH & PH is maintained and restructured by the help of CPWD, Govt. of India and also private vendors. This is a very tedious work as the development and maintenance part pass through lengthy process of prioritization of work, intimation to CPWD as requisition, planning of work in coordination with CPWD, preparation of preliminary estimate by CPWD as per the available budget. It has been observed in recent past that the volume of fund available compared to the requirement of maintenance of building, class room and office is very less than actually required. The reason behind this is historical and also aspect of management. This institute buildings except the BN Campus building are very old hence the maintenance and reconstruction are also very costly. To improve the situation, future need analysis was done and a committee was formed. The whole information was properly analysed and as per priority of work the maintenance and development of infrastructure were taken up.



Applying the analysis in the above pattern the essentials of infrastructure as per need were thoughtfully planned in the following pattern:



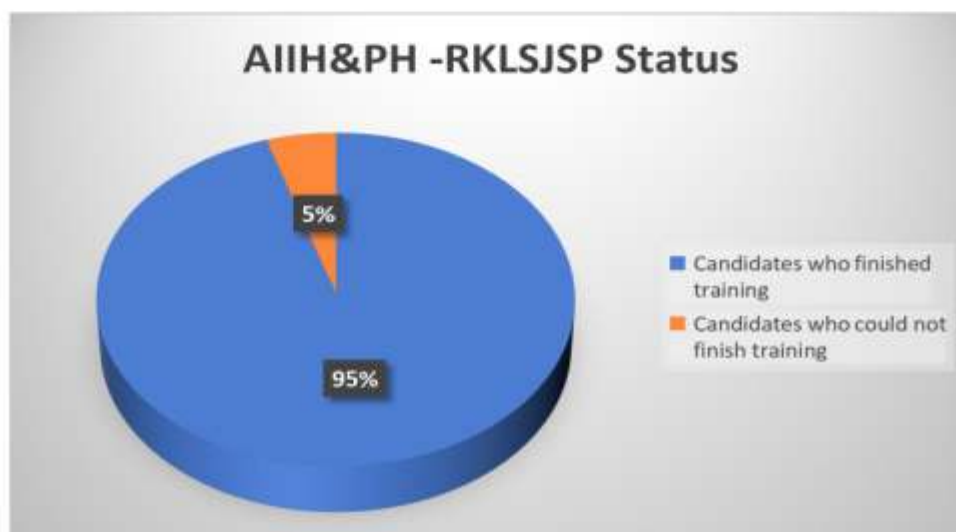
RASHTRIYA KARMYOGI LARGE SCALE JAN SEVA PROGRAM- PHASE II (RKLSJSP)

Rashtriya Karmayogi Large Scale Jan Seva Programme Phase -II (RK-LSJSP Phase II), an initiative by the Government of India to train government officials in citizen-centric service delivery and transform governance. The program focuses on shifting from a process-driven to a purpose-driven approach, aiming to train over 700,000 officials through a cascading training model where those trained become master trainers themselves.

AIIH&PH, one of the oldest Public Health Institutes in the country also participated in the program to instil a sense of 'Seva Bhaav' in staff to embark on a path of quiet revolution to realise Viksit Bharat.

SWACHHATA ACTIVITIES REPORT (2025)

The Swachh Bharat Mission has been an important pivot of activities for 2025, with multiple activities going on seamlessly most notable being the Swachhata Pakhwada in April 2025, the Swachhata Hi Seva (SHS) campaign in September 2025, and Special Campaign 5.0 in October 2025.

1. Swachhata Pakhwada (01–15 April 2025)

During Swachhata Pakhwada 2025, extensive cleanliness drives, awareness programs, seminars, plantation activities, waste management initiatives, and inspections were conducted across Main Campus, Bidhannagar Campus, RHUTC Singur, and UHUTC Chetla. Activities included cleaning of hostels, offices, laboratories, public health facilities, sanitation blocks, removal of scrapped vehicles, horticultural waste management, hand hygiene awareness, plastic hazard campaigns, and felicitation of Safai Mitras.

2. Swachhata Hi Seva (17 September – 02 October 2025)

Under Swachhata Hi Seva 2025 at Bidhannagar Campus, plantation drives, campus cleaning, footpath and hostel sanitation, pledge-taking ceremonies, health and eye check-up camps, sports and quiz activities, cleaning of spiritual places and market areas, and recognition of Safai Mitras were carried out. The campaign emphasized community participation, health, and dignity of sanitation workers.

3. Special Campaign 5.0 – Implementation Phase (October 2025)

As part of Special Campaign 5.0, AIIH&PH reviewed 77 physical files, weeded out obsolete records, conducted cleanliness drives at 37 sites, disposed identified e-waste, freed 205 sq. ft. of space, and simplified processes through installation of a grievance drop box. Cleanliness activities were supported with before-and-after photographic documentation.

Conclusion

The consolidated initiatives undertaken by AIIH&PH in 2025 demonstrate a sustained institutional commitment towards cleanliness, hygiene, waste management, environmental sustainability, and community participation in alignment with national Swachh Bharat initiatives. The active participation of the Director, faculty, staff, and students in Shramdaan activities reinforces the collective resolve to maintain a "clean, green, and healthy work environment", ensuring the long-term sustainability of the Swachh Bharat Mission's goals.

DEPARTMENT OF PREVENTIVE AND SOCIAL MEDICINE

The Department of Preventive and Social Medicine was established in 1973 with the objective of developing skilled and motivated workforce in the Public Health services including training of trainers and course facilitators for planning, organization and evaluation of National Health Programmes. Thus, ever since the days of its foundation, the department has been one of the backbones of All India Institute of Hygiene and Public Health through its multi-disciplinary functions in the form of research, education, and training interventions.

Mission of the department

The mission of the department is to train physicians to be effective public health professionals who will be able to address public health issues in both urban and rural areas with quality leadership and management skills. This department also envisions to empower people to achieve and maintain good health through comprehensive health care.

Brief about activities conducted by the department: 10 lines

- MD (CM) Three-year full-time course recognised by NMC and affiliated to WBUHS. Intake capacity of the MD (CM) course - **20** seats. At present, **42** students are currently pursuing the course in three batches
- Classes taken for other courses i.e. MD(MPH), DHS, PGDPHM, MSc (MCH), MSc (HPE), SHI, i-FETP and DHPE courses
- **70** participants were trained in **04** short training programmes, **1235** participants in online and offline, **05** national level training programmes by the department.
- **1159** participants were involved in **09** awareness programmes and **17** Observation of days in different settings.
- **10** academic visits were organized in different organizations for the three batches of MD (Community Medicine) PGTs
- Three extramural projects were completed by **3** faculties as Co-Principal Investigator
- The Department is the Nodal department for conducting Capacity Building on Public Health Emergencies Management in collaboration with Disaster Management Cell, Ministry of Health and Family Welfare, Govt. of India
- **32** thesis were completed, **39** thesis are ongoing **69** short studies were completed by Junior residents of the department
- **19** articles were published by students and faculties of the department

EPIDEMIOLOGY

The Department of Epidemiology, established in 1932 along with the Institute, is the first separate Epidemiology Department in any institute/college in India. It has played a pivotal role in shaping epidemiology and community health in the country. The department pioneered General Health Surveys in its Singur rural field practice area. It contributed to identifying Arsenicosis as a major public health problem in India. Work on epidemic dropsy (1930) and chronic arsenic toxicity (1980s) marked major milestones. The Sonagachhi Project (1992), initiated by the department, became a WHO-recognized model. It empowers sex workers through community-based interventions beyond HIV prevention.

The department has been the nodal agency for HIV sentinel surveillance in West Bengal and the North-East. It also serves as the nodal department for IDSP (TOT) and FETP in these regions. The department integrates biological, social, and analytical approaches to understand disease burden and improve population health.

Mission of the Department:

To reduce the disease burden in populations through education, research, and service by training students to generate and apply epidemiological evidence, conducting studies on disease risk factors, and providing primary health care as per IPHS norms.

To prepare postgraduate students for leadership roles in public and private health and research organizations.

Brief about activities conducted by the department:



MD (MPH) Epidemiology Three-year full-time course recognized by NMC and affiliated to WBUHS. Intake capacity of the MD (MPH) Epidemiology - 7 seats. At present 18 students are currently pursuing the course in three batches.

Intermediate Field Epidemiology Training Program (I-FETP) is initiated on 8th September, 2025 in collaboration with NCDC, New Delhi and CDC, India catering 7 North Eastern State, Sikkim, Jharkhand, Andaman & Nicobar Islands and West Bengal. The first cohort of 10 government officials from different states are being trained in 5 contact sessions over the period of one year for Surveillance data analysis, surveillance system evaluation, outbreak investigation and epidemiological study.

The Community Diagnosis Program, 2025, commenced on 17.11.2025 will, for the first time, be fully paperless, with all data collected using Epi-Collect.

DEPARTMENT OF PUBLIC HEALTH ADMINISTRATION

The Department of Public Health Administration was established along with the formation of the Institute in 1932. Col. A. D. Stewart was the first Head of the Department of Public Health Administration and also became the first Director of AIIH&PH.

In the year 1944–45, the Department of Public Health Administration of AIIH&PH, Calcutta, conducted the first Village Health Survey in collaboration with other departments. This general health survey covered nearly 1,200 families comprising about 7,000 members in West Bengal.

Since its inception, the Department has been actively involved in teaching, training, and research activities related to health systems, programme monitoring and evaluation, operations research, quality of care, disease surveillance, health information systems, disease epidemiology, disease prevention and control, and other aspects of public health.

Currently, the Department is coordinating the one-year Postgraduate Diploma in Public Health Management (PGDPHM)

Mission of the department

The mission of the Department of Public Health Administration is to prepare, educate, and develop healthcare leaders and professionals for the evolving health services sector who can positively impact the well-being of communities. The Department aims to pursue high-quality research to strengthen public health knowledge and interventions and to support the effective delivery of public health and health services.

Brief on Activities Conducted by the Department

The Department coordinated the Core Course Programme for MD Community Medicine, MD MPH (Epidemiology), MSc Public Health (MCH), MSc Public Health (Health Education), and MVPH courses. The current Core Course batch comprised 31 students.

The Department is coordinating the one-year Postgraduate Diploma in Public Health Management (PGDPHM) course supported by NHM, as part of a consortium of institutes including NIHFW, JIPMER, PGI Chandigarh, and PHFI. The course curriculum is currently under revision by the partner institutes.




More than 150 participants were trained through various short-term courses, training programmes, and workshops, such as the Short Course on Scientific Writing and Sensitization Workshop on Systematic Review and Meta-analysis, among others.

Over 300 participants were engaged in various awareness programmes and observance of health-related days in different settings, including World Health Day 2025, World Hypertension Day, Swachhata Programme, and Communicable and Non-Communicable Disease Control Programmes.

Four theses were completed, nine theses are ongoing (including one external PhD thesis), and three short studies were completed under the guidance of Department faculty.

Two research articles were published by students and faculty members. Additionally, faculty reviewed seven scientific articles for national and international peer-reviewed journals.

DEPARTMENT OF MATERNAL AND CHILD HEALTH

The Department of Maternal and Child Health is concerned with teaching, training, and research, and the delivery of services for mothers, children, and adolescents within the framework of general and reproductive health services. Emphasis is given to teaching and training for the delivery of health services through integration of preventive, promotive, clinical, and managerial skills. Obstetric and paediatric wards and adolescent health clinics of the neighbouring medical colleges, as well as the urban and rural health centres of AIHH&PH, Kolkata, are extensively used for practical/field-based hands-on training in reproductive and child health, adolescent health, and family welfare. The research activities of the department are primarily focused on reproductive health, safe motherhood, child growth and development, child health problems, adolescent health, and various aspects of family welfare.

Mission of the Department

To develop highly skilled professionals and managers to provide services in the field of Maternal and Child Health across various levels.

Brief Description of Activities Conducted by the Department:


In the past, this department used to run the Diploma in Maternity and Child Welfare (DMCW)—a postgraduate diploma course—since 1933. Since inception, a total of 990 doctors has been trained in DMCW. At present, the department conducts M.Sc. Public Health (MCH) postgraduate course. This is a two-year, full-time master's course and is affiliated with the West Bengal University of Health Sciences (WBUHS). This postgraduate course equips medical and nursing graduates for administrative, clinical service, and teaching/training positions and enables them to act as public health specialists and healthcare providers in different aspects of Maternal and Child Health/Reproductive and Child Health in government health services, teaching or non-teaching hospitals, healthcare delivery systems, non-governmental organizations, etc.

PUBLIC HEALTH NURSING

The department of Public Health Nursing was established in 1953 to develop nursing manpower for India and other Asian and African countries for assuming the responsibilities of community health nurses, nursing supervisors, specialist nurses, consultants (nursing), trainers (nursing) and administrators in wide variety of professional settings in the field of community health nursing. The Bhore Committee had recommended the creation of a category of nursing personnel for implementation of public health services at community level. In order to meet this need the department conducted regular courses – Certificate in Public Health Nursing (CPHN) from 1953 to 1972. The course was subsequently reframed as Diploma in Public Health Nursing (DPHN) and Diploma in Nursing Education and Administration [DNEA(CH)] and continued up to 2012-2013.

- Teaching, training and research in the field of Public Health Nursing.
- To develop highly skilled professionals and managers to provide services in the field of public health nursing across various levels.

DEPARTMENT OF SANITARY ENGINEERING

With an independent Department of Sanitary Engineering set up in 1938, AIIH&PH was the first in the country and possibly in the whole of South East Asia, to have such a Department in a Public Health institute. The Department had many courses in its heydays notably- Master of Engineering Public Health, Certificate course in Maintenance of Hand-pumps and rural sanitation.

The Dept. has conducted pioneering studies and operational research on community water supply and sanitation, on-site sanitation, pollution control of all major rivers, arsenic contamination of ground water in West Bengal and its remedial measures, pilot studies in solid waste management as well as provided advisory and consultancy services to various agencies like WHO, ICMR, MRD-GOI, UNICEF, UNDP, KMDA, CPHEEO etc. Owing to immense contribution of the departmental activities and research, it was instrumental in formulating the water pollution control laws of the country.


Mission of the department

The main objective of the Department is to create a healthy community through the ways and means to safeguard the environment and protection of the natural ecosystem.

Brief about activities conducted by the department:

- The Department conducts Chemical analysis of Drinking water under 17 different parameters for specimens received from various agencies including Government organizations and NGOs.
- Spectrophotometer based estimations started with few parameters.
- Certificate Course on Sanitary Health Inspector, a skill development course of 1 year duration since 2018, under Prime Minister Skill Development Program with an intake capacity of 25 students per batch. This is based on the National Quality Standards Framework (NQS) guidelines devised by Ministry of Skills Development and Entrepreneurship. 21 candidates currently pursuing course in session 2025-26
- Training conducted on 'Waste Management Techniques' on 23rd July 2025. 42 participants were the beneficiaries including students from MD(CM) and SHI.
- No. of outreach awareness programs conducted: Three
- Two programs on 'Hand Hygiene' & 'Swachhata' & one on 'Plastic – Hazards & alternatives. Cumulative participation – 200 persons
- Academic visit of students at Indira Gandhi Water Treatment Plant, Barrackpore on 7th March 2025 (Participants – 35 persons)

RURAL HEALTH UNIT & TRAINING CENTRE

RHU&TC, Singur was established in the year 1931 on a land donated by Mr. S.N. Mallick, a known philanthropist & social activist of Bengal. RHU&TC, Singur came under administrative control of AIIH&PH, Kolkata since 1944-45. RHU&TC, Singur is the rural field training area of AIIH&PH, Kolkata.

RHU&TC, Singur through its two PHCs and 19 subcentres, provides health care services as per National Health Mission to nearly 1/3 of the population under Singur block including migratory population of 23 brick kilns.

Mission of RHUTC: - Provision of field training in public health for both medical & paramedical students as well as delivering primary health care to the population under its jurisdiction.

Brief about activities conducted by RHUTC:

Activities of RHU&TC can be summarized under three key areas: -

A) **Public Health relevant:** - Field training to MD(CM) & MD (MPH Epid.) JRs from AIIH&PH, Kolkata and other visitor students from nursing & paramedical background from outside the institution.

B) **Health Care Delivery:** -

- i. OPD Services: - Various communicable diseases e.g. Acute respiratory infections, gastroenteritis, dermatological disorders, Vector borne diseases (Dengue, Malaria) etc and non-communicable diseases including Hypertension, Diabetes etc are being dealt with;
- ii. Laboratory services: - Various blood examinations including parasitological ones are being conducted besides examination of stool, urine and sputum samples.
- iii. MCH Services: - Antenatal care, Postnatal care, Vaccination services are being provided;
- iv. Implementation of national programs: - NTEP, NLEP, NVBDCP, SNID etc. are being implemented in partnership with State Govt. Counterpart.

C) **Conducting awareness campaigns** at the localities regarding prevention and treatment of diseases especially through our own MD Students as well as nursing students of visiting institutes.

URBAN HEALTH UNIT AND TRAINING CENTRE

The Urban Health unit & Training Centre, Chetla is urban field practice area of All India Institute of Hygiene & Public Health, Kolkata. The Centre was established in 1955. This centre is oldest of its kind in Southeast Asia along with its unique public health practice field. This centre provides community-based learning opportunity and quality teaching / training, not only to the public health students of the Institute but also from other health institutions of India.
